<b>Brief Description:</b>			
Sociology is the study of human behaviour, cultures, conflicts and rights. Students will study and carry out social actions, as well as, research current cultural conflicts e.g. girls rights to education, Ihumātao. Sociology students regularly participate in discussions, group work, presentations and essay writing. This course will be assessed under the Social Studies framework at Level 2.			
The course is differentiated for the needs of all learners. This means there are 2 pathways to achieve credits. All learners complete the three internal achievement standards, and then have the option in Term 3 of an external achievement standard to allow for subject endorsement, or a unit standard from Legal Studies.
