<b>Brief description:</b>						
<p>In the Level 3 History course learners have the opportunity to analyse contested historical events from New Zealand and international contexts. They will gather information from historical sources such as artefacts, films, guest speakers, and visits to historical sites to gain an understanding of the causes, consequences, and significance of important historical events</p> <p>For one of the internal standards each learner will be able to select a historical event of interest to them to research. Other historical events that may be studied in the course include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Invasion of Parihaka</li> <li>• The My Lai Massacre</li> </ul> <p>The study of History develops a range of valuable skills that prepare learners for tertiary study, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Effective research processes – selecting appropriate sources of information, referencing etc</li> <li>• Written communication - paragraph and essay writing</li> <li>• Verbal communication – expressing ideas and opinions</li> <li>• Critical and analytical thinking – thinking deeper about events and different perspectives on these</li> <li>• Connecting past with present – how past events have influenced social and political situations today</li> <li>• Separating fact from fiction</li> </ul> <p><b>Assessment Programme:</b></p> <p>Please note that we are able to offer flexibility with our assessment programme to suit individual learner needs. If learners choose to complete an external standard they will work with their teacher to identify the best standard option for them.</p> <p><b>University Entrance:</b></p> <p>History is a university approved subject and is a List A subject for The University of Auckland. Learners are able to gain university entrance internally as each of the three internal standards offers 5 credits. Alternatively they can gain university entrance from a combination of internal and external standards. History standards can be used for UE Literacy (see below).</p>
