Brief description:						
<p>In the Level 2 History course learners will explore the historical themes of revolution and reaction by gathering information from historical sources such as artefacts, films, guest speakers, and visits to historical sites. Learners will gain an understanding of the causes, consequences, differing perspectives, and the significance of four different events.</p> <p>Historical events that may be studied:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The struggle for Vietnamese Independence (The Vietnam War) • The Invasion of the Waikato (New Zealand Wars) • The Warsaw Ghetto Uprising (The Holocaust) • The French Revolution (Storming of the Bastille) <p>The study of History develops a range of valuable skills, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Effective research processes – selecting appropriate sources of information etc • Written communication - paragraph, and essay writing • Verbal communication – expressing ideas and opinions • Critical thinking – thinking deeper about events and different perspectives on these • Connecting past with present – how past events have influenced social and political situations today • Separating fact from fiction <p>These skills can be useful in a range of pathways including journalism, law, anthropology, politics, diplomacy, travel and tourism, museum curation, teaching, archives and libraries.</p> <p>Please note that we are able to offer flexibility with our assessment programme to suit individual learner needs. We are able to support learners with working towards UE literacy. Entry into the external standards will be discussed with each individual learner to identify the best option for them.</p>
